A Closer Look At Dry Eye Disease

Results from the National Eye C.A.R.E. Survey



Did You Know?

More than 8 in 10 (87%) optometrists surveyed (n = 502) report seeing an increase in the number of younger patients (aged 18-34) with dry eye symptoms now compared to 10 years ago.

The National Eve C.A.R.E. (Current Attitudes Related to Eve Health) Survey was conducted online within the United States by Harris Poll on behalf of Shire between July 6th and 27th, 2015. The consumer arm of the survey included a total of 1,210 US adults ages 18+ who report dry eye symptoms ("adults with dry eye symptoms"), including 375 adults who have been diagnosed with dry eye disease (or chronic dry eye) by a healthcare professional and 835 adults who have not been diagnosed, but experience dry eve symptoms and have used artificial tears to relieve those symptoms within the past month. The professional arm of the survey included 1.015 US adults ages 18+ who are optometrists (n=502) or ophthalmologists (n=513) ("ECPs").
